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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Members of VIVO BIO DISCOVERY SERVICES PRIVATE LIMITED

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of M/s VIVO BIO DISCOVERY SERVICES PRIVATE LIMITED ("the Company"), which comprises the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2016, the Statement of Profit and Loss and Cash Flow Statement for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

This responsibility includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that are operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We have taken into account the provisions of the Act, the accounting and auditing standards and matters which are required to be included in the audit report under the provisions of the Act and the Rules made there under.

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing specified under Section 143(10) of the Act. Those Standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

a) BASIS OF ACCOUNTING AND PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

These financial statements of the Company are prepared in accordance with the Indian Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) under the Historical Cost convention on the accrual basis except for certain financial instruments which are measured at Fair Values. GAAP comprises mandatory accounting standards as prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014. The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those followed in the previous year.

b) CASH FLOW STATEMENT

Cash flow statements are reported using the indirect method, whereby profit before tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of a non cash nature, any deferrals or accruals of past or future operating cash receipts or payments and item of income or expenses associated with investing or financing cash flows. The cash flows from operating, investing and financing activities of the company are segregated.

c) REVENUE RECOGNITION:

i) The Company follows the mercantile system of Accounting and recognizes income and expenditure on accrual basis.

ii) Revenue is not recognized on the grounds of prudence, until realized in respect of Liquidated Damages, delayed payments as recovery of the amounts are not certain.

d) PROVISIONS

Provisions are recognized when the company has a legal and constructive obligation as a result of a past event, for which it is probable that a cash outflow will be required and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation
